A GIS training workshop was held on Marsa Matroh, Egypt from 27th -29th Jan 2020 titled "Introduction to Geographic Information System (GIS) and Remote Sensing and their applications", the training was held at Matroh public library for participants from Desert Research Center (DRC), Sustainable Development Center of Matrouh Resources

(SDCMR), Matrouh governorate and The Agricultural Directorate in Matrouh.

The objective of the training course was to gave the stakeholders confidence to use the power of GIS to display, manipulate and analyses information geographically, with the result that they are able to make more informed decisions.



DEVELOPING THE NORTH AFRICA COASTAL AND MARINE ATLAS

The North Africa Coastal & Marine Atlas was introduced to identify, collect and organize coastal and marine spatial data. The atlas includes: base-maps, physical, biological, terrestrial coastal features, and hazardous and vulnerability hotspots of the North Africa coastal and marine conditions.
